Welcome! We are so happy to be part of One Yellow Rabbit's excellent High Performance Rodeo again! Please also check out our co-presentation of *Ephemeral Artifacts: Travis Knights* from Feb 2–4. The Rodeo is always a fantastic spectacle, don't miss it! But tonight...

This is not a wedding show, but dearly beloved, we are gathered here today to celebrate life!

OLD – With this performance, I wanted to support Alberta artists, and to satisfy long-time fans of DJD who always ask: "When are you going to do Vicki's red shoe piece again?" And so, the dance piece whose real name is Every Tap Show Needs a Soft Shoe, is back on the stage in all its glory!

NEW - Sarisa was an integral part of DJD for many years and I was thrilled when she accepted the invitation to create a new piece. I also wanted to give Sabrina, who has been dancing with DJD for 8 seasons, a chance to create something new. The show has recorded music, but I asked Sarisa and Sabrina to choose composers from Alberta to work with. Sarisa asked Rubim de Toledo to create music for her new piece called Habanera. Sabrina asked Luis Tovar to create something with the feeling of a storm, and to include the sound of steel pan drum for a unique Caribbean flare.

BORROWED – I was struck by Marie France's take of Stravinsky's *Rite of Spring* when I saw it last season. It is not jazz, but I dig the musicality and the drama, and many great jazz musicians have been inspired by this music. Marie's original cast was larger than the DJD company, so we invited 4 of the original dancers to join us.

BLUE – The "blue" parts are by me, created with a sense of whimsy and fun, because not all blues ache in the same way. I also included a couple of pieces from my recent repertoire to fill out the evening. I hope you enjoy the show!

BIOGRAPHIES



KIMBERLEY COOPER ARTISTIC DIRECTOR, CHOREOGRAPHER

Kimberley Cooper has been a part of DJD for over three decades, first as a dancer (1989-2013), then Resident Choreographer/Artistic Associate (2002-2013), and now as Artistic Director (2013-present). She has studied, taught, and performed all over the world. In 2002, she was named Emerging Artist of the Year by Alberta Dance Alliance, and since 2002 has created over 20 full-length works on DJD as well as numerous shorter pieces. Kimberley has created and performed in countless independent projects, served as an Artist in Residence during Calgary as Cultural Capital of Canada

in 2012, and was awarded Dance Victoria's Crystal Dance Prize in 2014 for her research in Brazil. She has contributed chapters to the books *City of Animals*, about *New Universe*, a work she created with American jazz bassist and composer William Parker (University of Calgary Humanities Dept. 2017); and *Rooted Jazz Dance: Africanist Aesthetics and Equity in the Twenty First Century* (University Press of Florida 2022). Kimberley was Artist in Residence with Fall for Dance North (Toronto 2020–2022).



VICKI ADAMS WILLIS FOUNDER IN RESIDENCE, CHOREOGRAPHER

DJD Founder in Residence Vicki Adams Willis carries on a family tradition that began when her mother, Alice Murdoch Adams, opened one of Calgary's first dance schools in the 1920s. In addition to teaching and choreographing for countless local and international organizations, Vicki founded the Jazz Division in UCalgary's Faculty of Fine Arts, Program of Dance in 1978 and co-founded Decidedly Jazz Danceworks in 1984 where she continued her role as Artistic Director for 29 years. Recent additions to her many accolades include UCalgary's 2020 Distinguished

Alumni Award for Lifetime Achievement, the Lieutenant Governor of Alberta's 2021 Distinguished Artist Award, her 2022 induction into Canada's Dance Collection Danse Hall of Fame, and a 2022 Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal.



SHAHRZAD AHMADI DANCER

Born in Vancouver, Shahrzad trained at Pro Arte Centre and graduated with their CatchingART Company. In 2013, Shahrzad graduated with a BA (Hons) from the Rambert School of Ballet and Contemporary Dance continuing with Rambert Dance Company in their production of *Alina Curva and The Creation*. Shahrzad moved back to Vancouver in 2016, freelancing with artists such as Amber Funk Barton, Heather Laura Grey, Peter Bingham, Jennifer Mascall, and Judith Marcuse. Alongside a dance career, Shahrzad explored her own choreographic compositions that have toured

British Columbia and United States. You can also find Shahrzad on IMDB with credits in film work.



CINDY ANSAH GUEST DANCER

Cindy Ansah is a Mohkistsis-based dance artist whose artistic practice extends into acting, writing, photography, videography and sustainable fashion. Cindy has had the opportunity to engage with local performing arts collectives such as Woezo Africa Music & Dance Theatre Inc., Casa De Naz, kloetzel&co, Forcier Stage Works, Calgary Core Contemporaries & BrownCow Collective with her dance films garnering local and global features. Recently completing her BFA in Dance from the University of Calgary, Cindy is currently devoting her creative capacities to multidisciplinary pursuits

and her collaborative endeavor as Co-artistic Director of the emerging all-Black contemporary dance company, NAPPY Dance Collective.



THYS ARMSTRONG DANCER

Hailing from Vancouver, Thys began dancing at RNB Dance & Theatre Arts with teachers Charmaine Nobes, Haley Walker, and Vicki View, among others. Thys has danced with Coastal City Ballet, under the direction of Li Yaming and Katie Bois, Ottawa Rhythm Initiative, and 3120Dance Collective Amsterdam. He has had the pleasure of performing works by Brandi Coleman, Lisa La Touche, Melanie George, Ben Stevenson, and Wen Wei Wang. Thys has been featured in *Centre Stage: On Pointe* (film) and in *Unreal!* (TV). Thys is thrilled to continue his journey into the world

of jazz in his second season with DJD.



SCOTT AUGUSTINE DANCER

Scott is a native of Vancouver and in his fourth season with DJD. He has danced extensively with the Vancouver-based contemporary company Wen Wei Dance as well with other companies such as The Company 605, Radical System Arts and Move the Company. Scott has played major roles in musical theatre including Riff in West Side Story for the Vancouver Opera and Rainbow Stage, Tulsa in Gypsy, and Neleus in Mary Poppins for the Arts Club Theatre Company.



KADIN AUMENTADO GUEST DANCER

Raised in Calgary, Kadin Aumentado is a dancer and choreographer who has newly finished her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance with Distinction at the University of Calgary. Although stylistically more contemporary now, she also trained in ballet, jazz, and hip hop. She has performed in many pieces through the university, but since graduating, has taken part in DSW's Quick + Dirty Festival and both choreographed and performed for the Dance YYC Showcase. Kadin looks forward to further developing and experimenting with her choreographic style and seeking

new opportunities to grow as an artist.



MARYN BJORNDAHL GUEST DANCER

Maryn Bjorndahl is a Calgary-born dancer, choreographer, and dance educator. With a passion for movement, she completed her BFA in Dance from the University of Calgary in 2017. Maryn has had the opportunity to work with local and international dance artists who have expanded her perception of the art form. Local credits include performances and work with the Alberta Dance Festival, Peggy Baker Dance Projects, kloetzel&co, W&M Dance Projects, ESIRA Dance, Cloudsway Dance Theatre, J-SIK Movements, Dance YYC, and the Ignite! Festival. Maryn is currently in her

second year of DJD's Professional Training Program.



CASSANDRA BOWERMAN DANCER

Cassandra Bowerman is a dance artist and educator originally from Stoney Creek, Ontario. After earning her BFA in Dance with Honours from Toronto Metropolitan University (formerly Ryerson University), she attended DJD's Professional Training Program in 2015/16. In the Greater Toronto area, Cassandra has choreographed a number of plays and dance pieces for the Hamilton Fringe, Toronto Fringe and Dusk Dances Hamilton Festivals. In Alberta, she has performed in Alberta Dance Festival, CrossCurrents, and with Project InTandem. Cassandra has a passion for rhythm, musicality and theatre and

she is eager to deepen her study of jazz and its roots in her fourth season with the DJD company.



BRONTE CHRISTIE COSTUME DESIGNER

Bronte Christie has been a purveyor and patron of the performing arts all her life and has been sewing for nearly as long. From starting on stage at the age of three in Nanton Community Theatre, she is excited for this opportunity to partner with DJD as Costume Designer. She hopes the wardrobe you see tonight will immerse you into the feelings and inspirations of each choreographer's vision. SABRINA NAZ COMĂNESCU DANCER, CHOREOGRAPHER

Sabrina Naz Comănescu has helped cultivate the Calgary dance scene for over a decade as a performer, choreographer, filmmaker, dance instructor, volunteer and as the artistic associate for the Diversity Performing Arts Club of Calgary. She has worked with Machel Montano, House of Dangerkat, Headly, The Hifi Club and has opened for international acts such as Pop Caan, Sean Paul and Kes The Band. She is a 2015 Black Gold Award recipient for best dance act and the 2017 Alberta Foundation of the Arts Young Artist Prize winner. BIOGRAPHIES



RUBIM DE TOLEDO COMPOSER

Award-winning bassist and composer Rubim de Toledo combines the influences of his Brazilian heritage and his dedication to the jazz tradition to create a refreshing and uplifting approach to music. Rubim has been working with DJD extensively since 2006 as a frequent bassist, composer, and musical director. In 2021 Rubim won the Western Canadian Music Award (WCMA) for Instrumentalist of the Year. In 2018 he won the WCMA for Jazz Artist of the Year. Rubim is also an Assistant Professor in the music program at MacEwan University in Edmonton. At MacEwan, he serves as the

head of the bass department, teaches arranging, directs ensembles, and curates the MacEwan Global Music Concert Series.



EMILIE FIELD GUEST DANCER

Emilie is a Calgary-based dancer and choreographer. Currently pursuing a B.A./ B.KIN in Dance and Kinesiology at the University of Calgary, Emilie has had the opportunity to develop her contemporary dance practice through training and performance with the university dance faculty and choreographers in the community. She has performed in Mainstage dance, Dance@Noon, Montage, and ONE dance spectacle. She plans to continue her contemporary dance and choreography training with the University of Calgary, eventually combining her

passion for dance with Kinesiology to provide dance-based occupational therapy.



MARA LIAO ESNARD DANCER

Rooted in Cuba, Mara is an educator, dancer, and choreographer who graduated from the National Ballet School in Havana. Through her time in YYC she has participated in several diverse festivals and collaborative works. Her passion and curiosity for jazz dance and music led her to immerse herself into DJD's Professional Training Program for two seasons. Mara was part of the DJD company for their 36th season as an understudy and she is thrilled to be back as a dancer this season. Mara is inspired to dig deeper into her mixed-race identities and discover how all

these backgrounds influence her artistry.



SARISA FIGUEROA DE TOLEDO CHOREOGRAPHER

Sarisa joined DJD in 1994 and was with the company for 22 years. As a dancer, she performed in over 40 DJD productions between 1994 and 2022, and was also Artistic Assistant, Artistic Associate and Artistic Director for some DJD productions. Her passion for jazz has taken her around the world, studying jazz and many of its "family members," especially Latin jazz. Apart from dancing with DJD, she performed with various choreographers, companies and directors including Theatre of the Living Statue, Sage Theatre and One Yellow Rabbit as well as in two independent

Bravo!FACT films. She has taught and choreographed extensively for schools and companies including Western Canada High School, Victoria School for the Arts, Theatre Calgary, the University of Calgary, Orchesis, Toronto Metropolitan University and La Bella Vita Arts (Vada, Italy). She currently resides in Edmonton with her family and is a primary school teacher in a Spanish bilingual program. Choreographing on DJD this year was like coming home, a soul-nurturing experience for which she is extremely grateful.



MARIE FRANCE FORCIER CHOREOGRAPHER

Marie France Forcier, MFA, is a choreographer, performer, writer, and pedagogue of western contemporary dance forms. Through studio work, public performance, and community initiatives, she researches at the intersection of somatic practices, trauma studies and choreography. Her body of creative and performance work has been presented on platforms of various scales across four continents. An Associate Professor of Dance at the University of Calgary's School of Creative and Performing Arts she is, in parallel, pursuing a PhD in Creative Practice at Liverpool John Moores

University through the Transart Institute (New York/Berlin).



KAJA IRWIN DANCER

Kaja Irwin is a Winnipeg-born dancer, choreographer, and dance educator. After deciding to pursue a career in dance after completing her B.A. in Political Science, Kaja studied in DJD's Professional Training Program, developing her love of both jazz and the Calgary dance community. Kaja loves to explore movement and collaborations across art forms, including mask, puppetry, clown and character work, as well as collaborating with Calgary jazz musicians developing improvised pieces for the stage. Kaja is excited about and dedicated to diagning deeper and exploring the jazz art

form and feels honoured to be back for her eighth season performing with DJD.



STEVE ISOM LIGHTING DESIGNER

Steve Isom is a Calgary-based lighting designer for dance, theatre and opera. He studied Design and Theatre production at St. Lawrence College in Kingston Ontario (1976–78) and at The Banff Centre (1979). His designs have been seen throughout Canada, the United States and Europe. Steve has designed for numerous Calgary and Edmonton dance and theatre companies over the past four decades including 28 years for University of Calgary's Division of Dance. His most recent work includes designs for choreographers Melissa Monteros, Wojciech Mochniej, Marie France Forcier, Kimberley Cooper, Yukichi Hattori and Davida Monk.



SHEMAR HEBERT UNDERSTUDY

Shemar Hebert was born in Calgary and is of Jamaican and Nevisian heritage. Growing up in a musical environment, Shemar's love for music is what first sparked his love for dancing. He began training in a myriad of street dance styles including, but not limited to, Afro House, Locking, Hip Hop, Popping and Dancehall. Shemar will continue to expand on his own choreographic endeavours and forms of artistic expression, while ensuring further exploration of his love for dance. Alongside fostering his own artistic identity, Shemar vows to pay homage to the cultures that have historically paved the way for the future generations.



NATASHA KORNEY DANCER

Natasha Korney began pursuing dance at the age of 13, specifically in the styles of Hip-Hop, Jazz, Modern, Contemporary and African Dance. As part of her training, she spent two years in DJD's Professional Training Program, performing in their annual show *Footprints*. In 2010, she commenced a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree, specializing in Contemporary Dance at the University of Calgary, and took part in performances such as Mainstage, *Why Dance 3D* and other productions. This is Natasha's 10th season with DJD, and she looks forward to performing in many more productions with the company.



MARCIA LIBER STAGE MANAGER

Marcia Liber is thrilled to be working her sixth season with DJD. 
working at DJD you can find Marcia freelancing around Calgary. Enjoy the show!
