MISSION STATEMENT

QUEST THEATRE is a professional theatre company that serves as a catalyst for creative communication, co-operation and change. **QUEST** develops and produces theatrical experiences that are relevant and important to young people. The **QUEST** experience enhances one's sense of self, engages individuals with issues in their communities and fosters ongoing connections to the performing arts.

WE'VE GONE THE DISTANCE

QUEST THEATRE was formed in 1984. Since then, we've visited approximately 7,333 schools with over 84 touring productions and performed for over 1,076,638 young people.

Since 1992, when we began our *Artists in School Residency program*, we've conducted over 257 residencies, in which 67,509 young people have actively participated. In addition, **QUEST THEATRE** operates a fall and winter *Theatre School* and runs an annual *Summer Drama Camp*.

MESSAGE FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR









PERFORMANCES

Students will work with QUEST THEATRE actor/teachers in predetermined groups to develop each assigned story or scene into a performance piece. On the final day of the residency, all the pieces will be presented as a tailor-made performance complete with set, costume pieces, simple props and lights.


FUNDING ASSISTANCE

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
